Over the last 18 months you have visited the following countries on mission.....

***What are your highlights from these trips?**

I give thanks to God for the way the churches are seeking to grow, especially the youth in Sierra Leone led by Emmanuel Sasu. He's doing a great work out there and God is really using him to touch lives there.

In Kenya I am very blessed to see the development of the Kenya leaders. They are doing a fantastic work in advancing the Kingdom of God.

These developments are quite encouraging. We thank God for the life of Apostle Peter and Pastor Ramsey also who have been behind the scenes overseeing this work.

Pst. Martyn has also been doing a tremendous work in South Africa. Pst. Martyn has been working with various ones to support and do the work in South Africa.

***What area do we need support on the mission field?**

We need missionaries sent from CLF. We need to heavily support and invest for future generations in terms of building properties. Including premises, church missionaries accommodations and church buildings. Locally is to bring the culture of the missionary mindset into the church. This starts from our Jerusalem where we have a sense of mission and put in the necessary effort abroad.

The Ghana mission field which is our oldest work needs reinvigoration, which we need to look at.

***What message would you like to give to our youth concerning missions?**

This is their time and season. They will rise up. That they will live for the work of Christ and not chase after delusional dreams such as fame and fortune. That there will be a new crop that will go where God sends them and do will of God.

***What stood out to you**

It's the leaders who are being developed. In Sierra Leone the young ones and the youth and in Kenya the women. High level of responsibility in Kenya also stands out. Emancipating themselves from a dependency mindset is quite encouraging to see and I trust that going forward. I trust that CLF churches across the board will have that same philosophy in ministry and in life.

What did you do personally?

In India, I had the opportunity to engage with the lepers in a leprosy colony, an orphanage and involved in a women's conference.

In Antigua, we had workshops in local schools.

In Ghana, it was more evangelistic and ministry in local churches.

Brazil: Our focus was outreach programs to drug addicts, prostitutes and ex prisoners. Outreach in the favelas.

I enjoyed hearing people's stories and praying for them the most and also learning about the different countries.

BISHOP PHILLIP ANKRAH

- UK, INDIA, SOUTH AFRICA, GAMBIA

The Lord had done some wonderful things in the South Africa, India and UK region. After the many trips to South Africa Pstr Martyn and Pstr Vuyani found and refurbished a place of worship in Sada eastern Cape, and now hosting vibrant services. The Fresh Start CLF South Africa Mission purchased a 500-seated custom made tent for outreach revival events and partnered with local churches for revival meeting, which saw 89 souls come to Christ. Pstr Vuyani also pioneered 2 fellowship groups on villages within 20 km of Sada. Fresh Start ministry has formed a farm project and please to report their first harvest. It's an exciting time and a great project with the objective gathering wealth for the mission work in South Africa.

Our work in India comprises of our church in Chennai and 5 churches in Andhra Pradesh. In the Andhra Pradesh tribal community there was a combined revival meeting in the village called Gadaparaayi including a 'Street-Gospel' meeting. Approximately 1500 Christian & non-Christian were impacted and blessed with the Word of God. In southern part of India, Chennai Pstr Cynthia oversees a dynamic church in a town called Padi. An 80 strong family oriented church that ministers effectively to the local community, including a thriving outreach to women, using special seamstress training to share the gospel, many have come to faith.

The UK Churches and ministries have been very active over that last year with reaching out to the community, supporting families during this energy crisis with provision of food. Our churches hosted wonderful Easter services with many attendees from the local community. Inside Out prison ministry continues to support ex-offenders and held an amazing service earlier in the year. Also a restorative justice course was held in ISIS prison. The summer programme this year was dynamic with a 100 children in attendance every week in Thamesmead for 4 weeks.

Some of the other great things the CLF UK have done are as follows. Medway CLF continues to strengthen couples with their thriving marriage ministry and reach out to the youth in the community with their football ministry. Edinburgh CLF continues to gather weekly in their teaching and discipleship and meetings. And for the community Pstr Martyn leads in an outreach to the football and boxing community. Kings House CLF have hosted dynamic services where God's presence and power came down with local residents been drawn into the meetings. Kings House continues to develop it's youth ministry. Genesis CLF have a successful hamper and foodbank ministry with many been drawn to church and coming to faith with many people baptised also. Life Centre continues to impact the leaders through leadership training.

KENYA

The CLF churches in Kenya since its inception in July 2015, has gone through different phases of challenges and highlights which have collectively contributed to its current formidable and admiring growth.

The church started off with one branch, BURUBURU, which later gave birth to other branches two more branches within Kariobangi and Uthiru respectively.

Over time, the Kariobangi branch sought to be independent from CLF hence leaving us With the Uthiru branch.

The Uthiru church is led by Pastor Sharon Adhiambo under the direct authority and instruction of the National Overseer (Pastor Evans Koomson). Its membership is largely populated with youth and kids.

Throughout the years, we have been able to raise and ordain 7 leaders as Pastors of CLF.

The very recent ordination of 5 Pastors happened in September 2023.

The ceremony was conducted by our very own Bishop John Dompheh (GENERAL OVERSEER) and Apostle Peter Mensah (REGIONAL OVERSEER) together with Rev. Evans Koomson (NATIONAL OVERSEER, KENYA).

The Kenya church over the years has instituted CLTI which is solely responsible for the training of our leaders and members and releasing them into practical ministry. The CLTI in Kenya is coordinated by Pastors Ann Tito and Jackie Mwihi.

In conclusion, the general population of CLF Kenya membership is predominantly youth, which accords us a great advantage in the near future. Within the year, the youth ministry has embarked on several retreats which captured people who are not even part of the CLF denomination. It suffice to say that some have become committed to serving God and joining the CLF community through these retreats.

Giving that Nairobi is densely populated with youth, who have genuine hunger for God but only few or no mentors, our modus operandi to reaching them is discipleship and fellowship.

The youth leader, Pastor James Kariuki works closely together with both branches to ensure a synergic and holistic growth amongst our youth. He does this through the youth retreats and an after-church event on Sunday called BIBLE HOUR- which solely aims at teaching, discussing and answering certain biblical truths and doctrines to ensure their establishment in the faith.

Our strive is to see the tangible movement of God in the hearts of our members, thereby affecting every fibre of their being and the society they live in.

LIBERIA

We started this year 2023 in a new community (Bassa Community, Adjacent 540 Junction, Congo Town Monrovia). At first it was challenging, because most of our old members couldn't relocate with us. But through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, we embarked on evangelistic activities that enabled us to penetrate with the gospel in the community, and the impact was great as many got saved and were added to our fellowship.

With our yearly theme "advancing the Kingdom of God through the Holy Spirit" we undertook the following major projects:

1. Impact 1000 YOUTHS SUMMIT, this summit focused on the evangelization and employment of youngsters for the great commission. The impact was great as Washington, Erica, Mary, Vannie and many other youngsters got saved and were added to our fellowship.

2. Inspiration Conference 2023, a three day activity that started with house to house evangelism, street CRUSADE and climaxed with a day conference with the objective of inspiring youths to get involved in the great commission. The impact was great as many became members of the evangelism team headed by Abraham Dumbuya a young missionary from Sierra Leone.

3. Monrovia gospel campaign, 5 days CRUSADE at various market grounds, junctions and town square. It was amazing as Sis Helena, Amanda, Jessica, Bandu, Joseph and many others got saved and were added to the church.

4. We baptised 8 converts out of the 27 that were added to our congregation this year. The Church is growing with an average attendance of 56 including children, with a youth majority.

Apostle visitation: we have been blessed to have Apostle Peter Mensah here on two different occasions this year.

He has always been a blessing with three days REVIVAL, and community CRUSADE which served as an inspiration to us, encouraging us to do more. The leadership training sessions were more fruitful as our leaders had the opportunity to ask questions.

Rev Edward Agyeman of Spread the gospel ministry from the UK has been a blessing with the believers Summit and empowerment summit focused on church edification and growth.

Challenges

We were pressed down but not destroyed. We are young and determined to do more, therefore we are trusting God for those equipment that make the work easier. Such as:

Projector, music drums and keyboard etc.

We highly appreciate your support towards our rent and other activities....and we promised to continue to advance the Kingdom.

SIERRA LEONE

Christian life fellowship Sierra Leone, was established in Sierra Leone in 2012 during the reign of Bishop Joseph Boadu of blessed memory, by Apostle Peter Sasu Mensah, Apostle Hassan Kamara and Pastor Evans Koomson. Several missionaries came later to strengthen the work and over the years, there has been a remarkable impact on the land. Many souls have been won into God's kingdom, several children have been sponsored to schools and many projects undertaken to the Glory of God.

Currently, there are five active churches and building projects ongoing.

CLF PORT LOKO

The headquarters of Christian life fellowship Sierra Leone, is based in the Port Loko district and is overseen by Pastor Obadiah Kanu, who acts as the national overseer. The church has a membership of 50 people including children. The challenge faced by the headquarters is security due to the location of the church building. There have been several break-ins and thefts on multiple occasions.

CLF MAFORKI

The church in Maforki, is also in the Port Loko district and is Pastored by Pastor Alpha Bangura. The church has served as a source of light and hope to Maforki and its environs, as people from neighboring villages attend service on Sundays. There is periodic evangelism organized by the church into villages. There is a current membership of 30 people including children. Church services are held in a locally made structure built by the community people. This structure is, however, deteriorating and there is an ongoing building project.

CLF BENGAL

The church in Benga is led by Pastor Emmanuel Hilton and has a membership of 28 people, including children. Church services are held in a classroom as there is no church building. Pastor Emmanuel donated a piece of land to the church and a foundation was laid to window level, but unfortunately the structure was washed away due to rains and lack of funds to continue the project.

CLF ROPOLON

The church in Ropolon is headed by Pastor Mariatu, a vibrant woman who has overseen the work for years. The church is located in the Ropolon village along the Lungi highway in Port Loko district. The church meets in the classroom of the Christian life community school as the church building is under maintenance and repairs. There is a membership of over 50 people including children.

SIERRA LEONE

CLF TIAMA

CLF Tiama is led by Pastor John Lavalie and has a fluctuating membership of 70 people. The church has a land which has not been developed and therefore meets in a temporary building. The church is also challenged with sound systems and instruments.

TOUCHING LIVES CHURCH

Touching lives church is the youth church of the Christian life fellowship, and is headed by Shepherd Emmanuel Sasu. The church was birthed in 2019 under Apostle Peter Sasu Mensah by two missionaries from Ghana (Emmanuel Sasu and Gloria Sasu) and Juliet Sesay from freetown. The church has undertaken several youth empowerment programs including computer training, educational conferences, and farming programs. There is an active membership of 15 youth. Church services are held at the CLF auditorium on Sundays and weekly activities are held in the mission house.

CHRISTIAN LIFE COMMUNITY SCHOOL (CLCS)

CLCS, is based in Ropolon and serves the people of the community. The school was established in 2019 and the building was completed in 2022. Currently, the population of the pupils is 31, and the classes range from class 1-3. There are 3 teachers presently. The school has brought literacy to the people of Ropolon and its environs but has the following hiccups.

First, the CLCS is unregistered with the ministry of education. Again, the school is understaffed and lacks professional teachers. Also, there is not enough financial support for the teachers, who are given stipends every other month. Last but not least, there is inadequate monitoring and supervision due to lack of funds.


ONGOING PROJECTS

Christian life fellowship Sierra Leone has three ongoing building projects at Maforki, Masiaka and Ropolon.

The church building at Ropolon was destroyed by the rains and by the help of the churches and members in the UK, is 90% done.

The building project at Maforki is at windows level who led the Masiaka building is at the foundation stage

GHANA

COVID affected churches globally and Ghana was no exception. Our congregations reduced in number from 16 congregations to 12 congregations. Attendance numbers went down, however, the churches are working on recovery. In the Accra district, our Alogboshie congregation, led by Pastor Diamond, moved from their old location where they previously met under very challenging conditions in a temporary structure, to a new better location in Achimota, where they have been fundraising and working hard at erecting a new permanent church building from scratch.

Every support you can give Achimota church would be greatly appreciated. Kindly forward any such support through Pastor Enoch or the church office to them.

Two of our churches in our Central district (Asafo and Ekroful congregations) in Swedru have merged back into Mahodwe congregation from whence they were originally planted out.

In the Eastern district, 2 churches (Osino and Koforidua churches) closed down

In the Accra district, our Kasoa congregation is looking for a new home. Your prayers and financial support would be greatly appreciated. You can forward your support directly to Pastor Peter or through the church office for the attention of Pastor Peter. To summarise, in Ghana, we currently have 12 churches in 3 Districts as follows:

Central District: Mahodwe and Moree

Accra District: Achimota, Kotobabi, Teacher Mante, Kasoa, and Macedonia

Eastern District: Habitat, Afiasa, Appapam, Moseaso, Abomosu

FARMING PROJECT - SIERRA LEONE & SOUTH AFRICA


